On April 4, 2014, U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) published a [30-day notice](#) in the Federal Register inviting public comment on a revised version of Form I-821D, Consideration of Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA).

USCIS will issue the final revised Form I-821D after the public comment period is over, the comments are addressed, and the form is approved. The revised Form I-821D will allow individuals to file either an initial or a renewal DACA request.

Individuals filing initial requests for DACA may continue to use the current [Form I-821D](#) posted on the USCIS website until further notice.
